Introduction

“this is the will of my Father – for everyone who looks on the son and believes in Him to have eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day”. Jesus Jn. 6:40

This study is designed to help a person decide who Jesus is from Jesus’ own words found in the gospel of John. The pen that God used to record Jesus’ words was John. Long after the other gospels had been recorded, God used John to present a deeper examination of the divine existence of the incarnate Jesus.

After careful examination of Jesus’ statement about Himself, you can decide whether you accept or reject who Jesus claims to be. From His statements you probably will have one of three responses: Jesus is really God. He was a deceiver, or He was not in His right mind. As others have succinctly put it: He was either a liar, lunatic, or Lord.

Your response will not only impact the rest of your life, but will determine your eternal destiny. Are you ready to meet Jesus? He has been waiting to talk to you. Let us listen to Him through His words:

“I have come as a light into the world, so that everyone who believes in me should not remain in darkness. If anyone hears my words and does not obey them, I do not judge him. For I have not come to judge the world, but to save the world. The one who rejects me and does not accept my words has a judge; The word I have spoken will judge him at the last day.” Jesus
Jn. 12:46-48

“My sheep listen to my voice, and I know them, and they follow me.” Jesus

A Christian’s Study Preparation

1. Hear Jesus and about Jesus by reading the Gospel of John. The gospel can be read in one week by just reading three chapters a day. Make it a priority. Set up a time and be disciplined about accomplishing this goal.
2. Ask yourself these 3 questions before you begin:
 1. What did Jesus say about Himself?
 2. Do you understand and accept what Jesus said about Himself?
 3. How does this change what you think, say and act? In simple words, how does Jesus impact your daily life?

Continue to think about these questions throughout your studies.

At the conclusion, personally answer these questions. Also, have specific scriptures that if someone was to ask you who Jesus said He is, you could give them chapter and verse.

3. Just do one section at a time. Thoroughly read all the verses and contemplate what Jesus says about Himself before proceeding to the next section. This can be done at your own rate, but at least do one section a week.

At the end of each section ask yourself how the identity of Jesus is challenging your life. Pray that Jesus will continue to open your eyes to see Him more clearly each day. Pray that His Spirit will guide you and empower you to walk closely with our Lord. Also, pray that God will give you the wisdom and courage to share Jesus with the lost world around you.

The following 7 proclamations of Jesus enlighten us to who He is. He clearly stated His role and identity in each of these proclamations. Jesus plainly explained what a person’s response to Him should be. When anyone obeys what Jesus commands then Jesus will keep His promises to them.

As explained in the “How to use” section of this study, the first “I am” is filled out as an example. Please read each passage and fill in what Jesus expects our response should be. Also, note His promises to us. After each response and promise section of the “I am” statement, the full context is listed. Then there are three key questions to answer about Jesus’ teaching in that section of scripture. These are followed by reference verses for further study.

The key questions are:

1. What did Jesus mean by this teaching?
2. Why did He teach it? What was the purpose?
3. How does this teaching impact your life; affect and effect you? Simply put affect is the process change and effect is the permanent alteration.

May the Lord guide your hearts in His love and fill your minds with His wisdom as we listen to Jesus the Savior.

How to use this study guide

Part I

Each section has three parts.

First, Jesus’ proclamation is listed in the title of each section.

Second, the scriptures are printed out from the NET (New English Translation) and NIV (New International Version). You can use any translation for your answers. There are 2 columns under the printed quotes of Jesus.

In Column 1, list what Jesus expects a person’s response to Him should be.
In column 2, list what Jesus promises to those who accept His role, His identity.

John. 6:35 is already filled out as an example for the remaining sections.

Third, under the heading and scriptures the full context is listed followed by the key questions and personal study section. This section contains some reference verses for further study and a personal application question that corresponds to the I am.

Part II

The traditional 7 “I am’s” of John were examined in part I of this study. There are many more passages in which Jesus explicitly identified himself. In part II, 7 other key “I am” texts are examined from the gospel of John. In some of these verses Jesus states His identity. In others, He responds to questions about His role as God’s anointed one.

“In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it.” Jesus

“He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God.” Jesus

Part II

1. Each section begins with Jesus stating who He is.
In the printed verse, please underline Jesus' proclamation about Himself.
2. Next, the chapter and verses containing the full context are listed. These are followed by reference verses. Try to take time to read them.
3. Personal understanding section. There are **three questions** in each section. **The first two** will help a person come to a deeper understanding of Jesus. **The third** question is a personal examination of our spiritual condition with Jesus.

Eight days later the disciples were again together in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" Then He said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and examine my hands. Extend your hands and put it into my side. Do not continue in your unbelief, but believe. Thomas replied to Him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are the people who have not seen yet believed."

We can see from this account, that Jesus did not want Thomas to have any doubt about who He is. Jesus wanted Thomas to know He is alive even though He had been crucified.

Jesus has that same desire for every one who will come to believe in Him. In part II of this study, **listen carefully** to Jesus; **examine His claims**; and **be blessed by believing in Him.**

Who do you say Jesus is? Jesus has plainly told us. Do you believe Him? If we believe, the confession of our heart and lips will be the same as Peter’s:

“You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.”
Mt. 16:16

And like Thomas our proclamation to the world will be:

“Jesus is my Lord and my God.” Jn. 20:28

Our lives will reflect our belief. Jesus expects us not just to acknowledge Him but to obey and follow Him (Lk. 6:46; Lk. 9:23). When we are truly His disciples He will truly be our Lord (Rev. 21:6-7). He will keep His promise to us and we will have life to the fullest now and forever (Jn. 10:9-10).

All Jesus’ disciples will go to be with Him for eternity in Heaven (**1 Thessalonians 4:13-18**). Everyone who has not accepted Him will receive the consequences of their decision (**Matthew 25:46**). They will be eternally separated from God (**Daniel 12: 1-2; Revelation 20: 10-15**). They will be sent away never to see the face of Jesus again (**Luke 13:22-30**).
This will be the saddest and greatest day in all human history.

Every human being is going to see Jesus on the judgment day (**Revelation 1:7**). Everyone will stand before Him and see who He really is (**John 5:20-29**). During our life on earth we decide who we think Jesus is. At the last day our decision to accept or reject Jesus as God, Savior, Lord will be revealed to all the universe. Jesus will be sitting on the throne and will either claim us as His sheep or disown us (**Matthew 25:31-34**).

May the prayer of Jesus be answered in your life:
“Father, I want those you have given me to be with me where I am, so that they can see my glory that you gave me because you loved me before the creation of the world.” Jesus
